Program Overview

- Duration: 2 years (starting September 2025 through May 2027)
- Cohort Size: Up to 12 scholars per year
- Expectations: <u>CFF-funded trainees</u> are required to submit an abstract to NACFC and are eligible to compete for a travel award

Program Activities

To successfully complete the CF Scholars Program, participants must attend at least **80% of the required activities** listed below:

- **CF Scholars Sessions (required):** Fridays, 2:00–3:00 PM (8-9 sessions per year)
- **CF Scholars Colloquia (required):** Evenings, 4:30–6:00 PM (3 times per year)
- CF Research Seminars (optional): Thursdays, 1:00–2:00 PM (weekly)
- Experiential Learning (optional): Shadowing opportunities in clinic and lab settings
